



LYON COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE MEDIA RELEASE

1. On Wednesday, December 28, 2022, after 3pm, Chief Deputy Sam Adams and Sheriff Brent White, along with Eddyville Fire Dept. and Lyon County EMS responded to the intersection of KY 93 and KY 293 for a two-vehicle injury collision. The investigation by Chief Deputy Adams revealed a 2019 Buick Enclave driven by Lander V. Nunez (25) of Riverside, CA was turning off KY 293 onto KY 93 South when he failed to yield the right-of-way and pulled into the path of a Northbound 2019 Dodge Caravan on KY 93 driven by Roger Lubben (61) of Eddyville. Three passengers in Lubben's vehicle reported minor injuries; however, all refused transport to the hospital.
2. On Saturday, December 31, 2022, around 8:55pm, Deputies responded to a report of sexual abuse in Kuttawa. The investigation conducted by Deputy Jeremy Hillyard and Deputy Joe Witherspoon resulted in the arrest of Joseph Ludvigsen (77) of Kuttawa. Ludvigsen was charged with one count of Sexual Abuse in the First Degree. He was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.
3. On Tuesday, January 3, 2023, around 5:30pm, Deputy David Carroll along with officers of the Eddyville Police Department and Kentucky State Police responded to a disturbance complaint in Kuttawa on New Circle Drive. The investigation by Deputy Carroll led to the arrest of Jeremiah I. Decker (46) of Kuttawa for the initial charge of Assault in the Fourth Degree (domestic violence). As the investigation continued, Deputy Carroll located approximately 3 ounces of Methamphetamine and a large quantity of plastic baggies as well as empty gel capsules and other evidence at the scene. Decker was additionally charged with Trafficking in a Controlled Substance-1st Degree (greater than 2 grams) and Drug Paraphernalia-Buy/Possess. Decker was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center. The investigation is continuing by Deputy Carroll and the Western KY Violent Crimes Task Force.

4. On Friday, January 6, 2023, around 12pm, SRO Deputy Jason Young initiated an investigation at the Lyon County High School as it pertained to a reported threat to the safety of the school. Deputy Young conducted multiple interviews and determined a 16-year-old male juvenile had made threats to bring a bomb and blow up the school. The juvenile was detained by Deputy Young and following a criminal complaint charging him with Terroristic Threatening in the Second Degree, he was lodged in the McCracken County Regional Juvenile Detention Center in Paducah. The investigation is continuing by Deputy Young.
