



## **LYON COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE MEDIA RELEASE**

1. On Saturday, January 15, 2022, around 5pm, Deputy Keith Suits, Deputy Seth P'Pool, and Eddyville PD Officer Shannon Oliver went to a residence on US Hwy. 62 East to serve a civil summons and arrest warrant. They made contact with Jennifer L. Chewning (35), also known as Jennifer Martin, of Marion, at the door of the home. When they confirmed her identity, she attempted to slam the door on the deputies; however, they forced entry to the home and arrested her without further incident. Chewning was charged on a Graves District Court bench warrant for Failure to Appear and with a Crittenden District Court bench warrant for Failure to Appear. She was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.
2. On Wednesday, January 19, 2022, around 1:15pm, Sheriff Brent White and Chief Deputy Sam Adams responded to a suspicious vehicle complaint off US 641 North of Eddyville. Sheriff White located the vehicle in a field area and then located two subjects who were trespassing on the property. The investigation revealed the two subjects were looking for scrap metal and got their vehicle stuck in the mud on property they did not have permission to be on. Sheriff White arrested Cynthia C. Lawler (47) of Paducah and charged her with Criminal Trespassing-3<sup>rd</sup> Degree and Criminal Mischief-3<sup>rd</sup> Degree. Deputy Adams arrested Scotty R. Skaggs (44) of Baskett and charged him with Criminal Trespassing-3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, Possession of Methamphetamine, Possession of Marijuana, Drug Paraphernalia, and Criminal Mischief-3<sup>rd</sup> Degree. Both subjects were lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.
