



## LYON COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE ACTIVITY REPORT

1. On April 17, 2021 at 11am, Deputy Sam Adams responded to a hit and run complaint at the Fivestar convenience store parking lot in Eddyville. His investigation revealed a 2017 Toyota Camry was at the gas pumps when the driver attempted to back out of the parking lot before colliding with another vehicle. The witness reports indicated the driver got out of the vehicle before pointing to the damage and then leaving the scene. Deputy Adams was able to identify the vehicle involved and learned the operator was in Kuttawa. He located the vehicle and driver at an address on Holly Lane. The driver, Daniel C. Barone (77), of Kuttawa was cited to court on the charge of Leaving the Scene of an Accident. There were no injuries reported in the accident.
2. On April 18, 2021 just after 8pm, Deputy Keith Suits responded to a single vehicle collision on US 62 West near Dustin Road, approximately 1 mile West of Suwanee. The investigation revealed a 2019 Chevrolet Colorado driven by John P. Slone (63) of Midway was West bound on US 62 when he collided with a deer in the roadway. The driver was not injured; however, the vehicle sustained significant damage.
3. On April 19, 2021 at 3:54pm, Deputy Joe Witherspoon responded to a theft complaint at the Boyd's Landing Recreational Area off KY 810 South. Between the hours of 9am and the time of the report, an unknown person(s) stole a catalytic converter and a diesel exhaust fluid (DEF) system from a parked 2016 Dodge 5500 series truck owned by a commercial fisherman. The damage and theft of the components is estimated to cost \$13,802.00. 4. On April 19, 2021 just after 4pm, Deputy Keith Suits responded to a report of juvenile children playing in the roadway on KY 819 (Sunnyside Loop). The children were reportedly unattended and in the center of the roadway at a dangerous location to themselves and traffic. Deputy Suits located the children involved and learned the mother was incarcerated and another family member was attending to an infant and was not supervising the other two children when the incident occurred. Deputy Suits charged Tonya M. Breaux (60) of Kuttawa

with Endangering the Welfare of a Minor. The Department for Community Based Services (DCBS) was contacted and responded to the scene. The involved children were subsequently removed from the home and placed with another family member. The investigation is continuing by Deputy Suits and DCBS workers.

5. On April 20, 2021 just after 10am, the Lyon County Sheriff's Office was dispatched to a burglary-in-progress 911 call at 1007 Joe Peek Road North of Eddyville. The caller reported a female trying to gain entry to an RV at this location and another male on the property. Both subjects were not known to the 911 caller. Sheriff Brent White arrived on the scene first and located a Nissan passenger car leaving the property. Sheriff White and Deputy P'Pool conducted a traffic stop on this vehicle. The passenger exited the vehicle quickly and was detained by Sheriff White. The driver was also detained by Deputy Seth P'Pool and found to be armed with a firearm.

The investigation by Deputies Sam Adams, Randy Clark, P'Pool, and Sheriff White revealed Logan M. White (35) of Mayfield and Misty D. Hendrickson (41) of Missouri, formerly of Paducah, had come to this residence knowing the property owner was incarcerated. The property owner was contacted, and he told officers that neither subject had permission to be on his property. A search of the vehicle the subjects were occupying revealed a stolen surveillance camera, stolen mail matter from the rural mailbox at the property, bolt cutters, a large metal file, and other burglar tools, a .22 caliber firearm, in addition to suspected methamphetamine and drug paraphernalia.

Logan White was arrested by Deputy Adams and charged with the following offenses:

1. Criminal Trespassing – 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree
2. Theft by Unlawful Taking – Under \$500
3. Theft of Mail Matter
4. Possession of Burglary Tools

Misty Hendrickson was arrested by Sheriff White and charged with the following offenses:

1. Criminal Trespassing – 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree
2. Theft by Unlawful Taking – Under \$500 by Complicity
3. Theft of Mail Matter by Complicity
4. Possession of Burglary Tools by Complicity
5. Possession of Controlled Substance-1<sup>st</sup> Degree, 2<sup>nd</sup> Offense (Methamphetamine)
6. Drug Paraphernalia – Use / Possession
7. Possession of Firearm by a Convicted Felon

In addition, Hendrickson was a fugitive from justice out of Missouri. She was additionally charged with a Parole Violation Warrant from Missouri. Both subjects were lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center. Kentucky State Police Troopers assisted sheriff's office personnel with this investigation.
