



LYON COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE ACTIVITY REPORT

1. On Saturday, June 12, 2021, at 9:30am, Deputy Sam Adams responded to a missing persons complaint South of Eddyville off KY 1055. The caller reported his 78-year-old wife had left their residence at 7am to go to the Dollar General Store on KY 293 and had not returned home. A cursory search of the area did not reveal the victim at the DG store, nor at any other stores in the area.

After searching for the female victim for nearly 2 hours in Lyon County, a Golden Alert was issued, and additional resources were summoned to aid in the search. Deputy Adams, Sheriff White, Lyon County Search and Rescue, local Fire Department personnel, and Kentucky State Police assisted in the search.

At 12:03pm, the Tennessee Highway Patrol notified Sheriff's Office personnel that the missing female had been located as a driver in a two-vehicle injury collision near Greenbriar, TN. She was transported to a local hospital in TN for treatment of her injuries.

2. On Saturday, June 12, 2021, at 9pm, Deputy Joe Witherspoon located Justin A. Kingston (30) of Kuttawa on Panther Creek Road following a theft and burglary investigation which began in May 2021. Kingston was charged on a warrant from Lyon District Court with Theft by Unlawful Taking – Over \$500, but Under \$10,000 and Burglary in the 2nd Degree.

Deputy Witherspoon's investigation revealed that between April 24, 2021, and May 18, 2021, Kingston sold a 2008 Jeep Commander to a Lyon County resident. The buyer of the vehicle took possession of the Jeep after purchasing it from Kingston. The buyer parked it inside his residence, North of Kuttawa.

The buyer was later contacted by the actual owner of the 2008 Jeep Commander who informed him that Kingston was not the actual owner. The buyer subsequently confronted Kingston in person about this allegation. The

investigation revealed Kingston, after being confronted by the buyer, left and drove to the buyer's home where he unlawfully entered the home and stole the 2008 Jeep back. The vehicle has since been returned to the actual victim. Deputy Witherspoon petitioned the court for an arrest warrant charging Kingston with the burglary and theft offenses.

3. On Saturday, June 12, 2021, at 11:05pm, while on patrol, Deputy Witherspoon stopped to check a stranded motorist on US 62 West. During this contact, Deputy Witherspoon checked the subject's driver's license and determined he was a wanted fugitive out of Vanderburgh County, Indiana for a Probation Violation.

Deputy Witherspoon arrested Landon B. Moore (22) of Waverly and charged him with being a Fugitive from Another State. He was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.

4. On Sunday, June 13, 2021, at 1:15am, Deputy Joe Witherspoon responded to a two-vehicle collision on US 641, approximately 2 miles North of Eddyville. The investigation revealed a 1992 Oldsmobile Cutlass, operated by Natalie J. Kleist (21), of Hopkinsville was stranded in the roadway when a 1995 Dodge Power Ram operated by Joseph N. Utley (24) of Fredonia came upon the stranded motorist and lost control before colliding with the stopped vehicle. No injuries were reported in the collision; however, Kleist was issued citations for No Insurance, Failure to Notify DOT of an Address Change, and an Instructional Permit Violation.
