



LYON COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE MEDIA RELEASE

1. On Sunday, June 12, 2022, around 5:30pm, Deputy Keith Suits conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle on West Main Street in Eddyville. Following a roadside investigation and a canine deployment of K-9 'Kaos' by Deputy Joe Witherspoon, evidence of marijuana trafficking was found in a 2011 Mercedes-Benz being operated by Osheana L. Oliver (29) of Eddyville. Oliver was arrested by Deputy Keith Suits and charged with the following offenses:
 - a. No/Expired KY Registration
 - b. Failure to Wear Seat Belts
 - c. Operating on a Suspended or Revoked License
 - d. Excessive Windshield/Window Tinting
 - e. Trafficking in Marijuana (Less than 8 oz.) – 1st Offense
 - f. Drug Paraphernalia-Buy/Posses

Oliver was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.

2. On Monday, June 13, 2022, around 7:32am, Sheriff Brent White and Deputy Joe Witherspoon were dispatched to an assault complaint at Boyd's Landing Recreation Area. Sheriff White located the involved parties and identified them as Amanda D. Anderson (40) of Carterville, IL, and Richard B. Davis (42) of Carterville, IL. Both subjects had been in a physical altercation, and both had obvious minor injuries. In addition, both subjects refused medical attention. Anderson and Davis were each arrested by Sheriff White and charged with Assault-4th Degree (minor injury), and both were lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center. EPD Chief Brook Dixon and the US Army Corps of Engineers also assisted the Sheriff's Office on this call for service.

3. On Monday, June 13, 2022, around 8:42am, Deputy Joe Witherspoon was dispatched to a two-vehicle, non-injury collision at the intersection of KY 93 South and KY 293. The investigation revealed a 2022 Ford driven by Craig Wyatt (50) of Washington, D.C. was stopped at the stop sign on KY 293 before failing to yield the right-of-way and pulling into the path of a South bound 2001 Chevrolet driven by David Schafroth (63) of Eddyville, who was on South bound on KY 93. Both drivers refused to be transported by EMS, and both vehicles were inoperable from the collision. Deputy Witherspoon was assisted on scene by the Eddyville Fire Department, Kentucky State Police, and Lyon County EMS.
