



LYON COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE MEDIA RELEASE

1. On Monday, August 29, 2022, around 7:35am, units were dispatched to a minor, single vehicle collision on I-69 near the 72-mile-marker. The investigation by Sheriff Brent White revealed the driver, identified as Emma Willis (17) of Princeton was operating a 2005 Nissan Maxima South bound when she began having a seizure. Willis exited the roadway before having a minor collision. She was transported by Lyon County EMS to Baptist Health Paducah for examination.
2. On Monday, August 29, 2022, around 1:50pm, 9-1-1 dispatch began receiving multiple calls of storm damage at Iron Hill Campground off KY 810 South. Lyon County EMS, Kuttawa Fire Department, and Sheriff Brent White were dispatched. Three properties were affected with two homes and two golf carts receiving significant damage from downed trees. One person was trapped in her home and was freed by neighbors before first responders arrived. Thankfully, there were no injuries reported in the incident. Sheriff White said the National Weather Service believed the storm was a microburst similar to what impacted Kuttawa Harbor Marina recently.
3. On Tuesday, August 30, 2022, around 9am, Stephen Clark reported a windshield on a tractor parked at his commercial property near the Eddyville Industrial Park had been broken and vandalized. Chief Deputy Sam Adams responded and took the report. If anyone has information concerning this incident, please contact the Sheriff's Office at (270) 388-2311.
4. On Tuesday, August 30, 2022, around 10:15am, Sheriff Brent White answered a theft of mail matter complaint in Suwanee on Fowler Road. The investigation revealed a female had entered a rural letter mailbox before leaving the area. Sheriff White located the female on Buzzard Rock Road and determined through investigation she had not stolen any mail matter; however, she was trespassed from the residence on Fowler Road.

5. On Wednesday, August 31, 2022, around 11:30am, Sheriff White answered an auto theft complaint on KY 819 (Sunnyside Loop). A female reported a 2002 Pontiac Grand Prix, dark blue in color, stolen from an unoccupied residence in the 6000 block of KY 819. The vehicle was last seen on the property the previous day (08/30/2022). This is the second vehicle reported stolen from the same property in the recent past.

On August 25, 2022, around 11am, a 2001 Chevrolet Blazer, red in color, was reported stolen from the same location. It was believed to have been taken between August 22 and August 24, 2022. 6. On Friday, September 2, 2022, around 6:30am, Sheriff's Deputies and Eddyville Police Officers assisted the KY Transportation Cabinet and Edwards Rigging with escorting an oversized, super load on KY 93 South from the Eddyville Riverport to I-24 and then on to Cadiz.
7. On Friday, September 2, 2022, around 9am, Chief Deputy Sam Adams arrested Kimberly M. Boyles (50) of Russell and charged her on a Boyd Circuit Court bench warrant for Failure to Appear. Boyles is lodged in the Ross-Cash Correctional Complex pending extradition to Ashland.
8. On Saturday, September 3, 2022, around 8:44pm, Deputy Seth P'Pool and other law enforcement personnel were dispatched to Vista Drive in Kuttawa for an initial 9-1-1 call of a disturbance involving a man dressed in only his underwear, who was running and yelling up/down the street.

Before deputies and officers could arrive, other calls to 9-1-1 were made concerning a similarly described male who took a bicycle from a child near Gum Street, before it was taken back away from him.

In addition, another 9-1-1 caller indicated a man and woman stopped in their SUV on the same street and the same underwear clad man attempted to climb into their vehicle, before they took off abruptly and the man rolled on the ground.

Upon arrival, deputies and officers learned the male subject also chased down a juvenile on an ATV (4-wheeler) and tried to pull a juvenile off the ATV in an attempt to take the vehicle.

Deputy P'Pool made contact with the male subject and determined he was heavily under the influence of an intoxicating substance. He was identified as Brian H. McCree (38) of Bowling Green (formerly of Marion).

It was determined McCree had been visiting a female at an apartment on Gum Street prior to these incidents.

McCree was arrested and charged with the following offenses:

- Public Intoxication-Controlled Substance
- Disorderly Conduct-2nd Degree
- Drug Paraphernalia-Possession
- Assault-4th Degree (child abuse)
- Criminal Mischief-3rd Degree
- Theft by Unlawful Taking
- Menacing

McCree was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.

During the investigation of McCree, deputies and officers made contact with a female associate of McCree's at 104 Gum Street in Kuttawa. A subsequent search at this apartment resulted in the seizure of suspected Methamphetamine, Marijuana, and drug paraphernalia. Deputy P'Pool also charged LaShawna Steward (43) of Kuttawa with these offenses.

The investigation is continuing by Deputy P'Pool. He was assisted at the scene by the Eddyville Police Department, Kentucky State Police, and Lyon County EMS.

9. On Sunday, September 4, 2022, around 7am, Sheriff's Deputies and Eddyville Police Officers assisted the KY Transportation Cabinet and Edwards Rigging with escorting an oversized, super load on KY 93 South from the Eddyville Riverport to I-24 and then on to Cadiz. The transport was made without incident.
