



LYON COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE ACTIVITY REPORT

1. On February 18, 2021 at 1:14pm, Deputy Sam Adams was dispatched to a reported burglary off Chestnut Oak Road near Kuttawa. The investigation revealed the victim was conducting some work on his property when he discovered someone had forcibly entered an outbuilding. Once inside, the building was rummaged through and items were stolen. If anyone has information concerning this burglary, please contact the Sheriff's Office at 270-388-2311.
2. On February 23, 2021 at 8:30am, Deputy Keith Suits served an Indictment Warrant on Jonathan R. McCoy (43) of Princeton, charging him with Receiving Stolen Property Under \$10,000, Arson-2nd Degree, and Persistent Felony Offender in the 1st Degree. The indictment was a result of an investigation by Sheriff Brent White from 2020 involving a stolen vehicle and arson incident near Kuttawa. McCoy is also the same offender charged by Kentucky State Police in the Trigg County murder of an elderly female from 2020. He remains lodged in the Christian County Jail.
3. On February 24, 2021 at 10:55pm, Deputy Joe Witherspoon responded to Days Inn Drive in Kuttawa regarding a disturbance. Once on scene, he determined the incident involved a physical domestic dispute between a man and woman. Martin J. Harper (47) of Dansville, NY was arrested by Deputy Witherspoon following an investigation and charged with Assault in the 4th Degree. The victim declined medical attention at the scene. Harper was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.
4. On February 25, 2021, Deputy Sam Adams served a criminal summons on Stephen Clark (37) of Eddyville, charging him with Theft by Deception Under \$500 (cold check).
5. On February 25, 2021 at 12:05pm, SRO Deputy Chris Smith charged two male juveniles at the Lyon County High School with Disorderly Conduct following a

physical fight complaint and disturbance at the school. The juveniles were released to the custody of their parents/guardians.

6. On February 26, 2021 at 10:09pm, Deputy Keith Suits was on patrol on US 641 approximately a ½ mile North of Eddyville when he observed a Northbound Nissan, with an equipment violation, traveling at 74mph in a 55mph zone. Upon turning around on this vehicle, the operator sped up and fled from Deputy Suits. Upon catching up to the vehicle, the operator continued to disregard lights and siren before fleeing into Caldwell County on US 641. In Fredonia, the operator drove through residential yard areas before becoming stuck in a ditch. The female driver then exited her vehicle and attempted to flee on foot while trying to eat unknown types of pills. She was the recipient of a Taser deployment which stopped her flight. She was taken into custody without further incident. She was examined by Caldwell County EMS on the scene, but not transported.

The driver was identified as Stephanie A. Miles (42) of Eddyville. She was charged with Speeding, One Headlight, Fleeing/Evading Police-1st Degree, Wanton Endangerment-1st Degree, Criminal Mischief-3rd Degree, Tampering with Physical Evidence, Resisting Arrest, and DUI-3rd Offense. She also has a pending charge of Driving on a DUI Suspended License-1st Offense. She was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.

7. On February 27, 2021 at 1:20pm, Deputy Seth P'Pool was dispatched to a disturbance at the Huck's Travel Center in Kuttawa. Upon his arrival, he made contact with a female complainant who stated a male semi-truck driver's dog had attempted to attack her small dog as she was letting it relieve itself. She stated she asked the male owner to restrain his dog; however, he allegedly started yelling, cursing, screaming, and threatening her. The female was fearful the male's dog was also going to attack her due to its behavior. Deputy P'Pool made contact with the male party, who was still cursing and yelling. He determined the subject was manifestly under the influence of alcohol and placed him under arrest. His dog was released to a girlfriend at the scene.

The offender was identified as Timothy S. Spellman (55) of Otto, NC. He was charged with Alcohol Intoxication in a Public Place and lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.

8. On February 28, 2021 around 7:05pm, Deputy Joe Witherspoon was dispatched to the area of US 62 and KY 295 in Kuttawa for a vehicle versus deer collision. No injuries were reported in the minor collision.
